Delphian Student Dress Code



The purpose of the Delphian Student Dress Code is to teach students to present themselves in a positive way and to have a well-represented student body with a high standard of appearance.

General dress code:

- Hair must be clean, well-maintained and acceptable for a professional setting. It must be well out of the eyes. No facial hair.
- Earrings are allowed, but no other piercings.
- Clothing must be clean and in good repair. It must be appropriate (no profanity or offensive words, undergarments covered, not too revealing). Clothing should suit the current activity. No shower shoes or slippers in the classroom.
- No hats or hoods in the dining room or classroom.
- No visible tattoos.

Fridays: Professional Dress Day

For Middle School and above, Fridays are designated Professional Dress Day for class time, assemblies, special dinners and other events, giving students an opportunity to practice dressing more formally.

Acceptable dress on Fridays:

- Coat and tie, dress shoes and dress socks. (A suit jacket is optional but encouraged.)
- Dresses, slacks/skirts and blouses.
- No evening or "party" wear.
